



Technician- Job Description

Key role: To act in a supporting capacity to the directors and all technical members of staff with project work, primarily based upon client sites throughout the UK.

Breakdown of role:

- To undertake site work including noise and vibration surveys, setting up of long-term noise/ vibration monitors, meteorological masts etc. as required and acting with the support of and on instruction from 24 Acoustics' engineers;
- To become registered to undertake sound insulation tests (at residential development sites) and undertake tests as required on client sites. To analyse test data and produce technical testing reports as required;

Hours of work:

- Core hours, 9.00 am- 5.30 pm Monday to Friday with 1 hour for lunch. Additional hours required to suit project requirements as described in the employment contract, flexibility required due requirements for early starts, late finishes and some evening/ over night work. A combination of overtime payments and time off in lieu will be made where necessary to accommodate additional working hours according to the needs of the company.
- The role will be based at 24 Acoustics' office located in rural Hampshire (just outside of Romsey). It is likely though that up to 4 days per week will be spent at client sites outside of the office.

Person Skills:

- Good command of written and spoken English;
- Good educational background with, as a minimum GCSEs/ O-levels in English and Mathematics at grade C or above;
- A recognised technical qualification, technician's apprenticeship, appropriate further education and preferably experience working in a technical role with electronic instrumentation;
- Good interpersonal skills- the role will involve liaising with people from all walks of life, including members of the public, construction site staff and client representatives;
- Ability to work unattended and unsupervised as required (although full training and support will be provided where required);
- Full driving licence;
- Flexibility to work occasional long days, overnight stays and anti-social hours;
- An understanding of a need for urgency and to work hard and calmly and accurately under pressure where required.

Appointment

- A permanent appointment will be made following satisfactory completion of a three month probationary period;
- Any employment offer will be subject to receipt of satisfactory references, evidence of qualifications, completion of a confidential medical questionnaire and a CRB check.
